We are serious about our music making and we want to give audiences in Melbourne the chance to discover new operas, all built around the best Australian artists available. The offerings in the 2025 programme were all major revelations to me when I first heard them, and their sheer power blew me away. So, here's to more revelations for more people this year.

Our aim is for audiences to ask themselves: "How did I live without knowing this piece existed?"

Continuing Victorian Opera's commitment to re-examine the great classics of music theatre, we are proud to present one of Stephen Sondheim's most iconic works: the 1971 masterpiece Follies. The works of Sondheim have

made up a large part of recent Victorian Opera seasons and we are now thrilled to add the holy grail of Sondheim's achievements.

Follies has never been presented in a full-scale production in Australia. Some special concert versions live in the distant memory of many musical theatre aficionados but, of all of Sondheim's works, this is the most elusive and, therefore, on the bucket list of many theatregoers.

Follies blends the past and present. It brilliantly showcases living legends, current music theatre stars and a new generation of artists.

The set and costume of Follies will be designed by Tony Award-winner Roger Kirk, a master of theatrical illusion, with lighting by Gavan Swift and choreography by Yvette Lee. They'll be joined by our own Phoebe Briggs conducting Orchestra Victoria.

We look forward to bringing the Follies extravaganza to life, creating the faded grandeur of a soon-to-be-demolished theatre, as well as glitz, glamour and artifice. Don't miss this rare opportunity to see a legendary show.

In April, we are proud to be presenting Jonathan Dove's Mansfield Park, our first opera in the newly refurbished Her Majesty's Theatre Ballarat.

This intimate opera beautifully captures the essence of Jane Austen's beloved novel, merging the themes of love, societal expectations and personal growth with the added allure of an historical setting. Enjoy the hidden world of the Regency drawing room as we dive into this timeless tale of manners, marriage and money.

Each year we relish the challenge of taking the magic of opera to students from diverse backgrounds. In 2025, we will present *The Lyrebird's Voice*, a new Australian work composed by Peter Rutherford with a libretto by Jayde Kirchert. *The Lyrebird's Voice* explores themes of belonging and welcoming through the medium of the Australian bush.

We will present this powerful story in three theatres in the outer suburban ring of Melbourne, enabling new audiences to experience a piece that celebrates finding one's voice.

In August, we are delighted to present a fresh take on *The*



Abduction from the Seraglio, Mozart's early exploration of the perils facing young love. It is a virtuosic score and never fails to delight an audience with its fresh and energetic brilliance. The drama's fundamental tension of East versus West could not be more pertinent. Mozart's genius chronicles this in a sublime musical way.

Mozart's glorious score will be conducted by Chad Kelly and sung in German with spoken dialogue in English, in a new translation by director and librettist Constantine Costi.

In October, we are proud to present one of the great operas of the 20th Century, *Katya Kabanova*, by one of the greatest operatic composers of all time: Leoš Janáček. Never-before-seen in Melbourne, Janáček's searing, powerful work is as devastating as it is beautiful. It is a riveting story with lush, romantic music inspired by Slavic folk songs.

Katya Kabanova is conducted by Australian/ British conductor and Janáček specialist, Finnegan Downie Dear. The orchestral scale of this work is monumental, and we are delighted to partner with the Australian National Academy of Music (ANAM), providing an opportunity for young musicians to deliver this glorious score. Young Australian director Heather Fairbairn makes her VO debut, leading an extraordinary creative team.

This is grand opera on an intimate scale.

As our final offering for the year, Horti Hall, our home, will be the setting for our VO Emerges opera: the quirky Australian Opera Boojum! by Martin and Peter Wesley-Smith.

Not quite an opera, not quite a musical comedy, *Boojum!* is an irresistible, contemporary snark hunt. Based on Lewis Carroll's legendary poem The Hunting of the Snark, the piece is nothing short of a deadly serious piece of fun. This is the perfect work to showcase the rising stars of opera in Melbourne.

So please, step through our door in 2025 to find the remarkable, the innovative, the diverse and the extraordinary. Each and every production is a revelation and a celebration.

The Victorian Opera Youth Chorus Ensemble (VOYCE) re-imagines the potential of opera and classical music for aspiring singers. Bringing together like-minded and equally passionate young people, VOYCE rehearses a range of operatic repertoire to develop skills essential to opera chorus roles.

Throughout the school year, participants have access to professional singers, repetiteurs and directors from the performing arts industry who provide educational and performance-based expertise. Members also have the chance to perform, which allows the practical application of skills learnt and strengthens the pathway into the company's newly established VO Emerges Program.

Directed by opera singer, composer and music educator Angus Grant, VOYCE provides weekly training for secondary school and tertiary students between the ages of 13-20.

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

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
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
